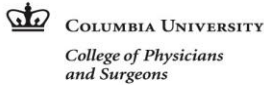

Goals and Objectives:

This program is designed to give an overview of the main principles of diagnosis and treatment of common conditions affecting the hand and upper extremity. Special emphasis will be placed on new advances in treatment as well as trends and treatment controversies. At the conclusion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Elicit a thorough history and perform a comprehensive physical examination
- Interpret important diagnostic studies, including radiographic studies, electrodiagnostic and laboratory data to make a diagnosis
- Be familiar with current and accepted treatments for the following conditions: flexor and extensor tendon injuries, nerve injuries, compressive neuropathies, vascular and pain disorders, and traumatic ligamentous and osseous lesions.

Who Should Attend:

This program is designed for orthopaedic residents, rheumatologists, plastic surgeons, hand surgeons, occupational therapists, physical therapists, and others involved in the care of patients undergoing hand surgery.

We encourage orthopaedic residents to attend to prepare for the OITE exam. A pre-test will be given during registration with OITE specific questions that will be reviewed and emphasized during the lectures.

This course will convey the main principles of diagnosis and treatment of conditions affecting the hand and elbow. Faculty from the tri-state region will provide a comprehensive review of congenital, traumatic, neurological and vascular problems affecting the hand and upper extremity.

Directions to Columbia University Alumni Auditorium

The most direct way to CPMC from most locations is to follow directions leading to the George Washington Bridge, then exit onto the Henry Hudson Parkway, and then onto Riverside Dr. (south). From there, continue south and turn left onto 165th St. (1st left south of the bridge). Proceed one block and turn right onto Ft. Washington Ave., then turn right into medical center parking garage. 630 W. 168th. where the meeting will take place is three blocks north of this parking lot.

From upstate New York, New Jersey, Connecticut: After crossing the George Washington Bridge, follow signs to the Henry Hudson Parkway (also called the West Side Highway), and then to Riverside Drive.

From Riverdale and Westchester via the Saw Mill River Parkway: Exit the Henry Hudson Parkway at the Riverside Drive exit immediately past the George Washington Bridge.

From Manhattan: Take the Henry Hudson Parkway to Exit 15-Riverside Dr. South.
